Fairfield County Commissioners' Office
March 13, 2007**

9:00 a.m. Community Development Block Grant Public Hearing

At 9:00 a.m., the Board of Commissioners met for a Community Development Block Grant Public Hearing.

Board members attending were: Mike Kiger, Jon Myers, and Judy Shupe.

Also in attendance were Carri Brown, James Mako, Holly Mattie, Robert Kalish, Charlotte Beyer, Ralph Martin, Danny Mahaffey, Marcia Duffy, Beverly Cooper, Lauren Gleason, Melody Borchers, Edwin Payne, John Cleek, and Brooks Davis.

Board President Mike Kiger read the following into the record:

"THE PURPOSE OF THIS PUBLIC HEARING IS TO PROVIDE AN OUTLINED EXPLANATION OF THE STATE OF OHIO'S COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT GRANT PROGRAMS, AND TO HEAR FROM THE LOCAL CITIZENS AND AGENCIES ABOUT THE NEEDS WITHIN THE COUNTY, AND ABOUT POTENTIAL PROJECTS.

THIS COMING FISCAL YEAR THE STATE HAS APPROXIMATELY 49 MILLION DOLLARS TO DISTRIBUTE THROUGH 12 DIFFERENT PROGRAMS. WE HAVE PROVIDED A HANDOUT WITH AN OUTLINE OF THESE PROGRAMS. EACH OF THESE 12 PROGRAMS REQUIRES AN APPLICATION TO THE OHIO DEPARTMENT OF DEVELOPMENT. YOU WILL NOTE THAT A TOWNSHIP OR MUNICIPALITY CAN APPLY DIRECTLY TO THE STATE FOR SEVERAL OF THESE PROGRAMS, WHILE FOR OTHERS, THE COUNTY MUST BE THE APPLICANT.

THE PRIMARY OBJECTIVE OF THE STATE'S COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM IS TO DEVELOP A SUITABLE LIVING ENVIRONMENT, PROVIDE DECENT HOUSING, AND EXPAND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITIES, PRINCIPALLY FOR PERSONS OF LOW- AND MODERATE-INCOME. THEREFORE ALL ACTIVITIES FUNDED MUST EITHER BENEFIT LOW- AND MODERATE-INCOME PERSONS; AID IN THE ELIMINATION OF SLUMS OR BLIGHT; OR MEET OTHER COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT NEEDS HAVING A PARTICULAR URGENCY BECAUSE EXISTING CONDITIONS POSE A SERIOUS AND IMMEDIATE THREAT TO THE HEALTH OR WELFARE OF THE COMMUNITY.

ALL BUT THE FORMULA ALLOCATION PROGRAM (#5 ON YOUR HANDOUT) ARE AWARDED ON A STATEWIDE COMPETITIVE BASIS. MOST OF THE PROGRAMS HAVE ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS THAT MUST BE MET IN ORDER TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION. SOME OF THEM ARE A 100% GRANT, WHILE OTHERS REQUIRE SOME MATCH WHICH CAN BE PROVIDED IN THE

FORM OF OTHER FEDERAL, STATE, OR LOCAL FUNDS. ALL OF THE PROGRAMS HAVE STRINGS; ENVIRONMENTAL CONCERNS MUST BE ADDRESSED, PREVAILING WAGES PAID, *ET CETERA*.

A COPY OF THE FULL DESCRIPTION OF THE PROGRAMS IS AVAILABLE UPON REQUEST FROM THE FAIRFIELD COUNTY REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION. THE OHIO DEPARTMENT OF DEVELOPMENT, OFFICE OF HOUSING AND COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS, CAN ALSO ANSWER QUESTIONS AND SEND INFORMATION; ITS PHONE NUMBER IS (614) 466-2285.

THE ANNUAL "FORMULA" PROGRAM IS #5 ON YOUR HANDOUT. EACH YEAR, THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS APPLIES FOR FUNDS UNDER THIS PROGRAM FOR VARIOUS PROJECTS WITHIN THE COUNTY.

THE CITY OF LANCASTER RECEIVES FORMULA FUNDS DIRECTLY FROM WASHINGTON. FAIRFIELD COUNTY ANTICIPATES RECEIVING APPROXIMATELY \$246,000 IN FORMULA FUNDS THIS FISCAL YEAR. AFTER ADMINISTRATION AND FAIR HOUSING COSTS ARE ACCOUNTED FOR, THERE WILL BE ABOUT \$200,000 TO ADDRESS PROJECTS IN THE COUNTY.

IF YOUR PROPOSED PROJECT WILL OCCUR IN AN AREA WHERE THE CENSUS FOUND THE MAJORITY OF THE HOUSEHOLDS WERE LOW- AND MODERATE-INCOME, IT WILL PROBABLY BE ELIGIBLE. HOWEVER, OTHER AREAS CAN BE SURVEYED TO ESTABLISH ELIGIBILITY, AND SOME PROJECTS BENEFITING THE ELDERLY OR THE HANDICAPPED ARE AUTOMATICALLY ELIGIBLE. THE COUNTY ASKS THAT ANY INTERESTED GROUP, VILLAGE OR TOWNSHIP, DISCUSS THEIR PROPOSED PROJECT WITH THE REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION SOON. APPLICATIONS ARE DUE TO THE COUNTY BY FRIDAY, APRIL 20, 2007. THE COUNTY MUST SUBMIT ITS LIST OF PROJECTS TO THE STATE SHORTLY THEREAFTER.

ALSO TODAY, BROOKS DAVIS OF THE REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION WILL MAKE A PRESENTATION ABOUT THE COUNTY'S FAIR HOUSING PROGRAM."

Commissioner Kiger then asked for public comment.
There were no public comments made.

Brooks Davis provided information about the County's Fair Housing Program.

One of the requirements of the federal program is that a Fair Housing Program be in place. Brooks provided a pamphlet of information about Fair Housing. Federal Fair Housing laws prohibit discrimination in housing based upon a person's race, color, religion, national origin, age, sex, handicap, of familial status. Familial status means that housing cannot be denied based on the existence of children in the family, for example; it also would apply to ensuing fair housing for a pregnant woman. Brooks commented that there were additional pamphlets available if anyone wanted to place them in their business locations or other areas.

Question: Beverly Cooper with ME Companies asked when construction for the projects could begin.

Brooks Davis responded that the application is due to the state the second week of July, and RPC will hear about approvals in October, at which time, there would likely be Board of Commissioners' approval, which means that construction could begin early in 2008 - with construction to be completed by the end of the calendar year of 2008.

Question: Melody Borchers asked when the applicants would be notified.

Brooks responded that the applicants would be notified in July.

Question: Danny Mahaffey asked about the automatic application for handicapped accessibility.

Brooks responded that the applications for handicapped accessibility were considered addressing a "limited clientele."

Question: Bob Kalish asked which projects would be considered favorable or not favorable.

Brooks commented that the Commissioners look at a variety of factors, including urgent need, how many people would be served, infrastructure needs, local contribution to the projects, and the whole spreadsheet of various factors – looking at however the investment would help the community overall. Judy Shupe added that the Board prefers to spread the money around throughout all areas of the county, to keep a fair distribution.

Question: Melody Borchers asked about a meeting with the planning group and asked about assistance in terms of match.

Brooks responded that the project could leverage additional funds, and the planning group was interested in meeting with interested parties.

Question: Danny Mahaffey asked if labor investment was still considered matching funds.

Brooks responded that the use of force account labor is still acceptable.

Brooks also reported that if anyone needs to do a survey, please get in touch with Regional Planning Commission as soon as possible. The new income limits have not yet been established at this point in time. Brooks reported that 51% of the area must be low-moderate income. If the 2000 census already demonstrates the low-moderate income status, a survey need not be prepared.

Jon Slater provided a copy of the County's current investment and depository policy, as requested by Carri Brown.

**REVISIONS TO FAIRFIELD COUNTY SUBDIVISION REGULATIONS
CONTINUED PUBLIC HEARING, March 13, 2007, 6:00 P.M.**

At 6:00 p.m. the Board of County Commissioners held a continued public meeting on the County Subdivision Regulations. Attending the meeting were Board members Mike Kiger, Jon Myers, and Judy Shupe. Also present were Carri Brown, Brooks Davis, Holly Mattie, and Harold Stebelton. Board President, Mike Kiger, read the following into the record:

“This is a continued public hearing to consider approving Titles I (General Considerations), II (Minor Subdivisions and Large Lot Subdivision Procedures), and III (Major Subdivisions) (in their entirety including proposed revisions) as well as revisions to portions of Title XII (Definitions), Section 4.9 and Section 5.2.7 of the Fairfield County Subdivision Regulations. The Regional Planning Commission held a public hearing on the proposed revisions on October 3, 2006 and adopted the proposed revisions. The Board of Commissioners held a public hearing on November 21, 2006, which was continued to December 5, 2006. On December 5, 2006, the public hearing was continued to tonight, March 13, 2007. Holly Mattei from the Regional Planning Commission office is present to answer any questions.”

After discussion, it was concluded that the Board of Commissioners found substantive changes have been made to the original amendments as proposed. Informational packets were available for any interested parties.
