

COURT REVOKES PROBATION FOR CAMIE STOLTZ AND IMPOSES FIVE YEAR
PRISON SENTENCE FOR CHILD ENDANGERING

June 5, 2012

Camie Stoltz will go to prison for the drowning death of her one year old son. Yesterday, she appeared before Judge Martin in the Fairfield County Court of Common Pleas for a contested probation revocation hearing. The Court found that based on the totality of her violations that she was no longer amenable to probation and imposed her full five year prison sentence.

On February 27, 2009, the Defendant entered a guilty plea to one Count of Child Endangering, a Felony of the Third Degree for leaving her one year old son in the bathtub where he drowned and died. She was sentenced to five years in prison suspended for a four year term of community control.

While on probation, the Defendant was charged with misdemeanor menacing charges for an incident with her husband on July 21, 2011. The Defendant pled no contest to reduced charges of disorderly conduct on April 26, 2012. Defendant was cited on February 29, 2012, by the Lancaster Police Department when she was found with a convicted felon at 12:50 a.m. In the course of the June 4, 2012, probation hearing, she admitted to a dating relationship with the convicted felon while on probation. Having no contact with convicted felons was a condition of Stoltz's probation.

Fairfield County Prosecutor Gregg Marx stated "Our office is pleased with the judge's decision, and feel some measure of justice has finally been served for the child whose life Defendant took."
