Shawn Agee Sentenced to 7 ½ years Prison for Drug Offenses

On October 10, 2013, Columbus resident Shawn Agee, was sentenced to 7 ½ years in prison for drug offenses. On September 27, Agee pled guilty to one count of Trafficking in Cocaine, a Second Degree Felony, one count of Possession of Cocaine, a Second Degree Felony, one count of Tampering with Evidence, a Third Degree Felony, and one count of Aggravated Possession of Drugs, a Fifth Degree Felony.

Agee was arrested March 1, 2013 by members of the Fairfield County Sheriff's Office Street Crime Reduction and Apprehension Program ("SCRAP") unit. At the time of his apprehension, the SCRAP unit located Agee with approximately 26 grams of cocaine, Oxycodone pills, \$3,664, digital scales, and tin foil used to package narcotics.

Fairfield County Common Pleas Judge Richard Berens sentenced Agee to a total of 7 ½ years of incarceration in prison. Agee was further ordered to forfeit the \$3,664 that was found to be proceeds from or contraband involved in the drug offenses for which he was found guilty. The case and sentencing was prosecuted by Assistant Prosecuting Attorney Zoe Lamberson.

Fairfield County Prosecuting Attorney Gregg Marx stated: "Our office is very pleased with this sentence and believe it sends a strong message that drug trafficking in Fairfield County will not be tolerated. I applaud our law enforcement agencies that diligently pursue these cases in order to protect our community."
