

SEAN HEISA SENTENCED TO 19 YEARS IN PRISON FOR ARMED ROBBERY SPREE

On 10/14/13 Lancaster resident Sean Heisa, 30, was sentenced to 19 years in prison for robbing 5 different Fairfield County gas stations with a loaded handgun in November, 2012. Last month Heisa pled guilty to 4 counts of First Degree Felony Aggravated Robbery, 1 count of Second Degree Felony Robbery, 1 count of Third Degree Felony Weapons Under Disability, and 5 specifications that he possessed a loaded handgun while committing each of the robberies.

Fairfield County Common Pleas Judge Chris Martin sentenced Heisa Monday to a total of 28 years in prison for these offenses, of which Judge Martin imposed 19 years of incarceration in prison, and suspended the remaining 9 for five years probation starting after Heisa's release from incarceration. Heisa was further ordered to pay \$525 restitution and have no contact with any victims, witnesses, or robbery locations in the case.

Fairfield County Prosecuting Attorney Gregg Marx stated: "We're very pleased with the Court's sentence, and consider it well warranted by the crimes committed by this repeat violent offender."

Heisa's conviction was secured through the investigation of several detectives from both the Lancaster Police Department and Fairfield County Sheriff's Office. The case and sentencing was prosecuted by Chief Assistant Prosecuting Attorney Darren Meade.
