#### Review

The Commissioners met at 9:03 a.m. to review legal issues and pending or future action items and correspondence. Commissioner Davis called the meeting to order with the following Commissioners present: Steve Davis, Dave Levacy, and Mike Kiger. Also present were Carri Brown, Staci Knisley, Mary Beth Lane, Jim Bahnsen, Dennis Keller, Jason Dolin, Todd McCullough, Michael Kaper, Jeff Porter, Tony Vogel, Aundrea Cordle, Chief Jerry Perrigo, Bob Clark, Carl Burnett, and Ron Osgood.

### Legal Update

Mr. Dolin reviewed the Prosecutor's Office record year in the number of Fairfield County felons committed to state prison. He provided a report, as attached.

Commissioner Davis asked if the current number of prisoners is directly tied to this report.

Mr. Dolin stated that a data company can compile additional information for a fee. The Ohio Department of Rehabilitation & Corrections (DRC) and the County Jail officials intend to move prisoners quickly to the state system.

Commissioner Davis reported that in 2013 the prisoner count was as high as 320. At that time, it was the new normal. In 2014 there was a dramatic leveling off. Commissioner Davis stated that the Board appreciated the work and information presented by the Prosecutor's Office.

Chief Jerry Perrigo stated that as of Monday night at midnight, the prisoner count was 199.

### Administration and Budget Updates/Carri's List

a. Highlights of Resolutions for the Voting Agenda

Ms. Brown reported on the highlights of the resolutions.

There is a proclamation to honor Representative and Mrs. Stebelton. They will not be at the meeting on the 20<sup>th</sup>, and the proclamation will be presented at another time. The proclamation was included in the memory book that the House of Representatives is preparing.

There are various financial resolutions to correct accounting structures, manage special revenue funds, approve then and now resolutions, and the payment of bills exceeding \$50,000. There are grant documents to approve, including a resolution of support for the visitation center. First quarter allocations for special revenue and agency funds are on the agenda.

Regional Planning proposes the approval of the Spring Creek Section 2 Phase 2 Easement Plat.

The Engineer proposes advertising and the process for road weight reductions as attached.

JFS proposes several contract renewals for network placements.

There is a Prevention, Contingency, and Retention plan update for JFS. This has been approved by the Children and Family First Council, which is the statutory approval agency prior to the Board of Commissioners. This adjustment allows for state and federal dollars to be used for specific assistance programs.

The option to purchase the furniture store property is on the schedule for approval.

Commissioner Davis stated that he appreciated the staff that worked on acquiring the option relating to the 330 Lincoln Avenue property. This provides help towards the jail project. It increases flexibility. Owning this property helps the aesthetic. It alters the view in a dramatic way. The proposed agreement has an option to purchase. He likes the option to purchase in case bids are higher than projected or that there are significant complications. He supports the option to purchase from a planning standpoint.

## 1. Administrative Approvals

Ms. Brown reported that the review packet contains a summary of administrative approvals. There were no questions about the administrative approvals.

#### 2. Discussion about Sensory Trail project

Last week, Ms. Brown reviewed grant opportunities relating to the sensory trail project. The grant opportunities were not a good match at this time because of the uncertainty relating to the project. However, there are donated services that are available for the project. Soil and Water officials are going to provide a letter to outline the next steps, which will ultimately include the Commission's approval of the donated work being completed on the county property. Ms. Brown offered to be helpful in the future as the group outlines its maintenance needs and agreements, as well as specific project costs.

#### 3. Energy Savings

Ms. Brown reported that the review packet contained a summary of the energy savings to date which exceed expectations at this point in time.

Mr. Keller reported that the report shows that the county's energy savings project is better than on target with the amount of savings. There is return on investment (ROI)

on the project. The report is through November. Dynamix will be reporting the savings until July or August of 2015. They have direct access to our billings.

Commissioner Davis asked if a warm December would impact the reports.

Mr. Keller stated that it was not impacting the reports up to this point but could see more savings in the future.

Commissioner Davis asked if the county had resources to report on future savings after the contract with Dynamix has ended.

Mr. Keller stated that the county has resources to monitor in the future.

#### 4. Land Bank Meeting

Ms. Brown reported that there is a Land Bank Meeting at 2pm today. The review packet contains a draft agenda.

Mr. Bahnsen stated that he would introduce Michael Kaper at the meeting. An update to acquiring properties will be discussed also.

Mr. Kaper reported that there are grant time constraints on acquiring properties. The deadline is March 31<sup>st</sup>. He is working with Assistant Prosecutor Josh Horacek on acquisition of the properties. He will also connect with the Ohio Housing Finance Agency to inquire on extending the deadline as needed.

### **B. Public Safety Facility and Financing Update**

Dennis Keller reported on the plans that were submitted to the City of Lancaster. We will resubmit with the required fees or additional documentation, but we wanted to provide information as quickly as we could.

Commissioner Davis reported that the financing is in really good shape. The General Fund debt payment is about \$1.65 million in 2015, and for 5 years out the budget includes \$2 million, including the budget for 2015. With the premium from the bond sale, the capital project budget should be about \$800,000 to the good.

## A. Certified Public Records Training

Ms. Brown reported that the review packet included an announcement about the Certified Public Records Training that is to be held in Fairfield County on March 6 at 10 am.

Ms. Knisley will schedule Commissioners Davis, Levacy, and Kiger for the Public Records Training. Ms. Brown has already registered. A global email was sent to the employees, as well.

### B. 2015 Calendar Update

Ms. Brown reported that the review packet contained the special dates for 2015, including Wearing Blue on April 8 and Circus Night/Candlelight Walk on April 23, which are the most recent dates added to that list. Also, she noted that the offices are closed on Friday, July 3<sup>rd</sup>.

### C. Customer Service Training

Ms. Brown reported that the date for the County Customer Service Training Seminar is March 12. The seminar is to define customer service as a core value for Fairfield County government, recognize elements of communication to improve for internal and external stakeholder relationships, and understand how effective customer service affects an organization.

# RECORD YEAR IN THE NUMBER OF FAIRFIELD COUNTY FELONS COMMITTED TO STATE PRISON

Fairfield County Prosecuting Attorney Gregg Marx announces that 271 Fairfield County convicted felons were committed to state prison in calendar year 2013 (the last calendar year for which full data has been compiled) as a result of the cases indicted and prosecuted by the Office of the Fairfield County Prosecuting Attorney. This represents an all-time high for the number of convicted Fairfield County felons sent to state prison in one year and is a 33% increase over the number of Fairfield County felons committed to state prison in 2012 (204). In calendar year 2013, 36.5% of all Fairfield County felons were sent to prison for drug offenses, an increase of 6% over 2012 and 12% higher than the 24.5% average for drug offenses from 2004 to 2013. A further breakdown of that data show that of the 36.5%, 12.5% was for Trafficking in Drugs; 14.4% was for the Illegal Manufacture of Drugs; and 9.6% was for Drug Abuse.

According to Prosecutor Marx, "These numbers show the significant drug problem facing Fairfield County but they also show that the combined efforts of our office and law enforcement, including the SCRAP and the Major Crimes Units, are bringing large numbers of those involved in the drug trade in Fairfield County to justice. Our office will continue to aggressively prosecute trafficking and other drug crimes and, where appropriate, seek state prison terms."

Marx also announced that there were 20 trials in 2014, with 16 of those resulting in guilty verdicts. In 2015 there have already been two trials, both of which resulted in guilty verdicts.

Prosecutor Marx stated that "I am extremely proud of how hard the people in this office work to try to protect the citizens of this county while seeking justice."
