Review

The Commissioners met at 9:01 a.m. to review legal issues and pending or future action items and correspondence. Commissioner Davis called the meeting to order with the following Commissioners present: Steve Davis and Dave Levacy. Also present were Carri Brown, Staci Knisley, Ray Stemen, Josh Horacek, Amy Brown-Thompson, Tony Vogel, Todd McCullough, Mary Beth Lane, Jon Kochis, Jeff Barron, Jim Bahnsen, Dennis Keller, Chief Alex Lape, and Aundrea Cordle.

Legal Update

Commissioner Davis stated he was aware of a letter drafted to the Attorney General requesting an Opinion on what constitutes official duties of the office of Commissioner, relative to Commissioner Kiger's expected absences. He asked when the letter to the Attorney General would be sent to the Attorney General.

Mr. Horacek replied that the request would be emailed today. He was told that the response would be returned to us quickly.

· Administration and Budget Update/Carri's List

a. Announcements

Ms. Brown announced the following:

Commissioner Davis reported that he spoke with Commissioner Kiger yesterday. He seemed to be doing very well. Staci Knisley delivered Commissioner Kiger's birthday card to him yesterday.

- a. Highlights of Resolutions

Ms. Brown highlighted the resolutions proposed for the voting meeting.

The County Engineer proposed approval of the RUMA relating to the Columbia Gas B System Modernization and an extended liability agreement with Artek Oil relating to road closing and testing.

Thinking about the RUMA, Commissioner Davis stated he touched base with Tony Sala with Columbia Gas (TransCanada) and expects to receive further documentation soon about a matter relating to County Utilities. Commissioner Davis will forward the information to the County Prosecutor's Office.

Ms. Brown reported that the County Engineer also proposed setting a viewing and hearing date (March 13) for a Winchester Road Culvert improvement.

We proposed the completion of the process for satisfying a mortgage and claim relating to the Neighborhood Revitalization Program (through Community Action administration).

There were financial resolutions to approve, such as:

- Reimbursements by operation of law for Job and Family Services;
- Appropriations from unappropriated funds for the County Prosecutor (for non-general fund activity, for the VOCA grant) and for the Airport; and

• The payment of bills (as needed).

Next week, the ID Networks contract (relating to 911) will be on the agenda. There will also be 1 be a financial resolution to continue the services of the Reentry Coalition. We are proposing to cover the program (which was formerly a grant funded program) for its potential to reduce recidivism and to continue the good work of the Coalition. Val Carpico previously provided a presentation to the Board of Commissioners, and we attended the statewide coalition meeting in December at Liberty Center.

(In addition, in the future, the Sheriff will need to move additional appropriations from contract services to employee salaries, probably, essentially based on the hiring of an employee, when the function was previously a contracted service with a temporary agency. This change does not need to happen right away, and the Sheriff's Office will monitor this.)

Also for next week will be the resolution to continue the administrative agent relationship of the Board of Commissioners for the FCFACF Council, among other financial resolutions being prepared.

b. Administrative Approvals & Budget Update

Ms. Brown highlighted the administrative approvals for the week, and a summary was in the review packet.

Ms. Brown also reported the total estimated annual cost savings compared to the current rates is \$34,762; the total estimated annual cost savings compared to average 2017 rates is \$30,903. The vendor selected is MidAmerican Energy, though May 2021.

Ms. Brown asked if there were any questions about the summary, and none were posed.

Ms. Brown requested the Board of Commissioners consider naming Staci Knisley, Budget Officer, as Acting Clerk to the Board of Commissioners, during the family leave of Ms. Elsea and at any other time the Clerk is unavailable. (The position description of Ms. Knisley includes this aspect already; the motion is to reflect the intention of the Board of Commissioners for signatory purposes.)

a. Invitation to Bid for the Demolition of 221 E. Main Street (old Jail)

Dennis Keller reported that the advertisement for the bid will be on Thursday, February 22, 2018. The pre-bid conference for contractors will be on March 7, and the bid opening will be on March 16.

Commissioner Davis added that the asbestos abatement is going on right now.

Mr. Keller reported that he has been in touch with Cyndi Smith regarding the artist rendering for the jail. He has sent her pictures of the jail. She asked for the County's permission for the drawings, and Mr. Keller provided permission. There is no commitment for the Commissioners.

Mr. Keller also reported that management of "jail scraps" such as the steel bars will be included in the bid process. The contractor will take ownership of all scrap left behind. This aspect should be factored into bids.

Commissioner Levacy asked that Mr. Keller check on the ceiling to make sure it is secure without the roof shingles in case of rain.

Mr. Keller reported that there is nothing left that can be damaged. There is mostly concrete left. He added there will be a 3-foot grade to the alley side filled in. He will next submit plans to the city for the parking lot construction. The parking lot will gain around 40 spaces once completed. They will also continue the retaining wall and keep the Main Street façade in mind.
