### **Review Meeting**

The Commissioners met at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioners' Hearing Room of the Historic Courthouse at 210 E. Main St., Lancaster, OH. Commissioner Davis called the meeting to order, and the following Commissioners were present: Dave Levacy, Jeff Fix, and Steve Davis. Also present: Aundrea Cordle, Jeff Porter, Rochelle Menningen, Bennett Niceswanger, Dr. Carri Brown, Lisa McKenzie, James Bahnsen, Amy Brown-Thompson, Bart Hampson, Corey Clark, Dan Neeley, Jon Kochis, Tony Vogel, Rick Szabrak, Marty Norris, Francis Martin, Stephanie Taylor, Ray Stemen, Judy Stemen, Melissa Conner, Amberly Hannum, Mike Burns and Peter Marbach.

### Welcome

Commissioner Davis opened the meeting by welcoming everyone in attendance.

### **Airport Authority Project Update**

EMA and Facilities Director, Jon Kochis, provided a PowerPoint presentation that is available in the minutes. Mr. Kochis spoke about a commercial style hangar proposed for the Fairfield County Airport and stated that there is a plan that could accommodate any hangar lease for any company in Central Ohio. The Airport Authority made the decision in January of 2021 to implement a waiting list, which requires a deposit, for those wanting to lease a hangar.

Commissioner Davis asked for clarification on the waiting list, the type of hangars customers want to lease, and for who is making the recommendation for the airport.

Mr. Kochis stated that the Airport Authority Board is collectively making the recommendation.

Commissioner Davis asked about the exclusion of the additional option which was formerly noted as option "C".

Mr. Kochis stated that option "C" contained a degree of financial risk.

Deputy Treasurer, Michael Kaper, who is a member of the Airport Authority Board, stated that the Board has concerns about building a spec building without a current lessee in the building and added that the Board does not believe the current management plan is set up for a commercial hangar at this time.

Commissioner Davis spoke about the ability to build a corporate hangar if one is requested by a company.

Mr. Kochis stated that the Airport would be able to accommodate building a specific hangar in a short timeframe.

Mr. Kaper stated that a corporation wanting a corporate hangar would want more input on location and other structural details.

Economic and Workforce Development Director, Rick Szabrak, stated that a corporation would want to build a hangar to spec and that ability exists.

Mr. Kochis continued by presenting on the Return on Investment (ROI) proposed figures and other details.

Commissioner Davis asked about the ROI analysis and how it is affected by occupancy rates.

Commissioner Davis stated that he looks at the cost of construction and anticipated revenue when considering the ROI.

Commissioner Fix asked about the factors that go into the lease rates.

Mr. Kochis stated that the Airport Board reviewed similar leases in Central Ohio and that proximity to airport amenities is also a factor in lease rates.

Mr. Kaper stated that the lease rate in the proposal is slightly higher than the rate for the current hangars due to proximity to amenities.

Mr. Kochis stated that the proposed hangars accommodate mid-size jets, and that a larger aircraft would require some updates to the runways. He added that the prospective tenants would be required to provide an application.

Commissioner Davis inquired as to the number of tenants and whether an airplane could drive through the hangar from one side to another.

Mr. Kochis said there would be four tenants and that there would only be one door for the plane and a man door on the opposite side of the hangar.

Commissioner Davis asked to speak about construction costs and what factors into cost estimates.

Mr. Kochis stated that they have been watching how costs are tracking in Central Ohio for these types of hangars.

Commissioner Davis asked if contingency numbers were built into the figures.

Mr. Kochis confirmed that 10% was built into the proposal figures.

Utilities Director, Tony Vogel, discussed the relocation of sewage lines and the lift station.

Commissioner Davis asked if costs associated with the relocation of the lift station had been put into the proposed project figures.

Mr. Vogel stated that the relocation of the lift station is part of an ARP project.

Commissioner Davis asked if the lift station project would go forward if the airport project did not.

Mr. Vogel said it would continue as a scaled down project.

Commissioner Fix asked about runway improvements that would allow for larger jets.

Mr. Kochis stated that grooving the existing runway, or adding concrete, would be required for larger aircraft to use the airport. He added that grooving is the cheaper option.

Commissioner Levacy asked about the language in the hangar leases.

Mr. Kochis stated that the leases for the T-hangars are for one year and that we anticipate the leases for box hangars will be longer. He added that the leases currently have a 3% rate increase per year.

Commissioner Levacy asked if steel or wood construction costs were proposed, and Mr. Kochis confirmed that the costs were estimated with the use of steel.

Mr. Kaper stated that the Airport Board met with County Treasurer, James Bahnsen, Mike Burns from Baird, and County Administrator, Aundrea Cordle, and that the recommendation is to conserve cash and finance through a bond. He added that for this type of project the county would need to go with a taxable bond.

Commissioner Davis started a conversation on reimbursing the General Fund.

Mr. Kaper spoke about debt service payments and gave the total estimated rent that would be collected over thirty-five years.

Mike Burns with Beard said there are two ways to look at financing. One is opportunity loss on your cash and the other is rating.

Mr. Kaper stated the recommendation is to conserve the cash and move forward with the bonding.

Commissioner Davis asked when it would be feasible to discontinue financing and pay off the project.

Mr. Burns stated that the earliest you could pay off due to yield on bonds would be five to seven years and that paying off earlier would cause a higher interest rate on the bonds.

Commissioner Davis spoke about the current rates the county is getting on investments.

Commissioner Levacy asked why tax-exempt bonds were not available.

Mr. Burns stated the county could not do tax-exempt due to having leases with private businesses and tenants.

County Auditor, Dr. Carri Brown stated that a resolution could be passed to reimburse the General Fund. She also spoke about possible additional costs.

Burns stated it is harder to sell shorter term bonds because the interest rates increase.

Commissioner Davis asked if all project costs would occur in 2023.

Mr. Kochis stated that the costs would come at the end of 2023 and throughout 2024.

Mr. Burns stated that interest would be incurred during the construction and continued speaking about project costs and cash flow.

Regular Meeting #16 - 2023 – April 18, 2023

Commissioner Davis stated he is comfortable with the county's financial standing.

Dr. Brown stated that the Commission could have an agreement with the Airport Board regarding the funding.

Mr. Kochis stated that airport operations are extremely solid.

Airport Clerk, Staci Knisley, stated that she has no concerns regarding the health of the General Fund.

Mr. Kochis added that the airport hangars were over 80% occupied when the economy was at a low in 2010.

Commissioner Davis stated he values the service Mr. Burns has provided.

Mr. Burns stated this is a small financing project and that he supports the county's decision.

Commissioner Levacy stated he would like to see figures based on financing \$3M for fifteen years.

Mr. Szabrak stated that he supports the Airport Board and the project.

Commissioner Fix thanked Mr. Szabrak, Ms. Knisley, Mr. Kochis, Mr. Kaper, and the rest of the Airport Board members for providing the right approach.

Ms. Cordle thanked Mr. Burns for his work on the financial proposals.

### **Public Comments**

Ray Stemen of Lancaster spoke about his concerns regarding political conservatives and how he believes they are unprepared to lead. He prayed for guidance for leadership.

Judy Stemen of Lancaster spoke about headlines she had found online regarding the FAA and the roll out of the COVID-19 vaccine.

Melissa Connor from Pleasantville spoke about an educational meeting regarding solar energy.

Peter Marbach with Senator Vance's Office introduced himself and offered his services.

Stephanie Taylor with Habitat for Humanity thanked Rick Szabrak and the Workforce Center (WFC) for space used at the WFC to build walls and other home essentials for projects in the community.

#### Week in Review

ARP Update

County Administrator, Aundrea Cordle, stated that of the \$30,606,902 received as the first and second tranche of fiscal recovery funds, \$23.7M has been appropriated, \$12.6M expended, and \$3.95 encumbered or obligated.

### Child Abuse Prevention Breakfast

Ms. Cordle reported that Job and Family Services held their Child Abuse Prevention Breakfast at Life Church Vineyard in Pleasantville on April 12<sup>th</sup>. At the Breakfast, Child Protective Services Deputy Director, Sarah Fortner, presented the 2023 Partner for Kids Award. This award was presented to a community partner who advocates for the strengthening of families and the well-being of children. The recipient has consistently demonstrated an unwavering commitment to the betterment of Fairfield County. The 2023 Partner for Kids Award recipient was our very own Commissioner Dave Levacy.

### Bottoms Up Diaper Drive

Ms. Cordle stated that Lori Hawk spearheaded a diaper drive for the County with great results and County employees collected 2,447 diapers.

#### **Homestead Program Update**

The main goal of the Homestead Program is to help citizens stay in their home. The program is for senior citizens and disabled Veterans. The County Auditor administers this program on behalf of the state. Recently, we sent correspondence to participants because it is time for them to report changes relating to their participation in the Homestead Exemption Program. *Overall, more than 8,000 homeowners in Fairfield County are participating in the Homestead Exemption Program. If there are no changes to report, participants do not need to complete or return the form that was sent to them.* 

#### Software as a Service

At the end of last year, we were fully transitioned from being self-hosted to a subscription-based Software-As-A-Service (SaaS) system for Enterprise Resource Planning. SaaS addressed needs for improved continuity of operations, improved access, and improved cybersecurity as part of a public health response because SaaS:

- allows for multi-site operations without additional costs to the county;
- provides for additional server hardware capacity for other critical services, such as electronic communications;
- reduces the cyber threat-plane;
- increases efficiency for county personnel, such as IT specialists and systems analysts, who would have improved capacity to respond to recovery measures; and
- reasonably reduces anticipated downtime.

Month-end & year-end activities have been conducted with improved efficiencies. There have been fewer incidents of downtime and updates have occurred regularly with SaaS.

#### Statewide Parcel Map



The Ohio Geographically Referenced Information Program (under the Ohio Department of Administrative Services) is creating a statewide parcel map. This is an initiative to *create a digital parcel map for Ohio by aggregating local parcel datasets utilizing geographic information systems* (GIS) technology. Fairfield County is showing leadership in its participation with the work group.

#### **Board of Revision Cases**

As of April 12, there were 38 property valuation complaints with no pending action to be heard by the Board of Revision. The deadline for filing a complaint for valuations as of the tax lien date of January 1, 2022, was March 31, 2023. We do not expect additional receipts of filings in the mail, given the time that has passed since March 31, 2023. The Board of Revision activity should be concluded by the end of May, except for the possibility of some administrative activities. All hearings have been held and concluded prior to noon, with the regular meetings beginning at 8 am.

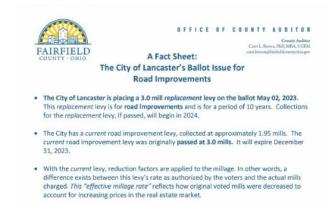

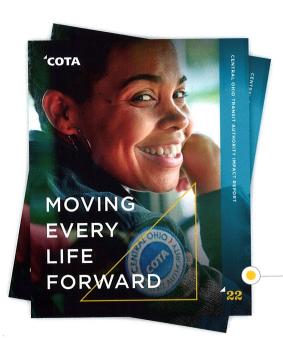

### Welcome

Commissioner Davis opened the meeting by welcoming everyone in attendance.

### **Public Comments**

Melissa Conner approached the podium and stated she is opposed to solar projects.

Josh Berry of Pleasantville spoke about the recent Regional Planning Commission meeting and stated that he was encouraged that residents of the county are still concerned about farmland. He added that Intel and solar energy projects are taking farmland from the county. He stated that he believes solar is not wanted by most residents and that it is in the best interest of all that the right balance of farmland and development is found. He concluded by asking for action that would exclude solar projects from being constructed in the county.

Mike Conner stated he is opposed to solar projects.

Dale Solt stated that his grandparents bought 106 acres in the early 1900's and that a fifth generation is currently farming the land. He spoke about the Amanda Township solar project and contracts received by the developer.

Issac Berry of Pleasantville stated he is an eighth-generation farmer. He spoke about farming in 2050 and the legacy being created now for future generations. He added that Fairfield County does not have to follow the path of the rest of the United States regarding solar energy.

Francis Martin of Pleasantville stated he has been attending planning meetings for the purpose of accessing solar projects.

Sherry Pymer of Walnut Township stated that the Federal government is pushing solar energy and she believes it will begin taking land by eminent domain for solar fields. She added that Ohio does not get enough hours of sunlight to justify the plants.

David Zollinger of Millersport stated he is also opposed to using farmland for solar.

Karl Elder of Pleasantville stated he is opposed to using farmland for industrial solar.

Regular Meeting #15 - 2023 – April 11, 2023

Seth Pymer of Walnut Township stated he will be financially affected by solar energy through escalated food prices. He also spoke about escalated prices for energy in California due to the shutting down of coal and natural gas power plants. He added that if production at the plant on the Ohio River was increased by 10%, it would cover all the solar energy that is being proposed by plants in Ohio. He also stated that he believes solar energy is not efficient in Ohio.

Ray Stemen of Lancaster spoke about using chemicals on livestock and the approval of vaccines for dairy and beef cattle. He stated that the vaccines are genetically altered and spoke briefly about mRNA vaccines. Mr. Stemen prayed for wise decisions from leaders in the United States.

Judy Stemen of Lancaster stated that health, food, and fuel are interlinked. Ms. Stemen provided highlights from articles she had located online. She later interjected that high food prices will cause revolt and revolution.

Barb Martin of Pleasantville stated she opposes using farmland for solar energy.

### **Active Transportation Plan Update**

OU student, Karina Peggau, presented an update for Fairfield County's Active Transportation Plan. She spoke about being an Ohio University student and provided highlights of the project. She then provided an overview and goals of the plan, and existing conditions of active transportation routes within the county.

OU student, Carlos Iniguez, provided information on the Active Transportation Plan. He spoke about the four project goals and how they guide plan recommendations. He provided information regarding infrastructure and used a map to show existing conditions.

Ms. Peggau continued the presentation and recommended regular maintenance on infrastructure, suggested ways to connect destinations, and installing mobility hubs.

Mr. Iniguez stated that the recommendation/approach for the City of Lancaster would include address use of sidewalks. He stated that Violet Township could be a gateway to the rest of the county, and continued by speaking about metro parks, new development, utility easements, and the implementation process He further discussed funding, timeline and an implementation matrix which he provided on screen.

Commissioner Davis thanked the students and commended them for the conciseness of their presentation.

Commissioner Levacy stated that it is good that the Buckeye Lake Bike Path is included in the Plan.

Commissioner Fix added that the students had presented at a Regional Planning Commission meeting and that they had obviously done a lot of work on the project. He added that he looks forward to the grant opportunities mentioned.

American Rescue Plan Update

From the \$30,606,902 received as the first and second tranche of fiscal recovery funds. \$23.7M has been appropriated, \$12.3M expended, \$3.8M encumbered or obligated.

Diaper drive

The Hall of Justice, Auditor's Finance group, Commissioners' staff, HR, JFS, and Juvenile Court staff all participated in the Bottoms Up Diaper Event. There is a picture provided in the packet of diapers collected in support of the event. The event was geared to raise public awareness and provide both diapers and financial support to purchase diapers for parents who otherwise may not be able to go to school or work due to being unable to provide diapers to leave with their childcare provider. The Bottoms Up non-profit agency reported that one in three families need help to diaper their babies.

The Elected Officials and Department Heads Roundtable

The Elected Officials and Department Heads Roundtable was held on April 4th at the Fairfield County Agricultural Center with over forty people in attendance. Hicks Partners, LLC provided an update on the grant submission process, and townships and villages throughout the county were able to participate in the update either in-person or virtually.

Department and agency updates were provided by those in attendance, and it was a great reminder of what a great community we live in and of the great talent that is a part of Fairfield County.

South Central Power's New Office

There will be a tour for public officials of South Central Power's new headquarters on May 16<sup>th</sup>, from 11 am – 12:30 p.m., located at 720 Mill Park Dr., Lancaster. Mr. Porter stated that Fairfield County would like to thank South Central Power for their continued investment in our community. The \$30+ million investment houses 200 employees and merged three South Central Power offices into one.

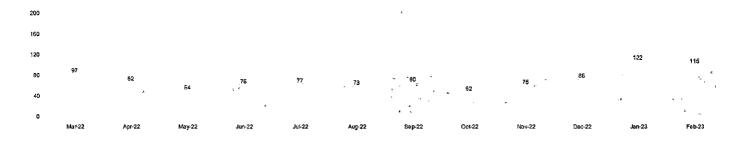

Main Street, Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 3:55 p.m., excluding Holidays. When paying in person, please bring your entire bill. A 24-hour drop box is also available for accepting utility payments and is located on the Broad Street side of the Municipal Building to the right of the steps. The drop box is collected each business day morning. We also offer Automatic Bank Draft in which your payment can be automatically debited from your checking or savings account by providing basic account information, please contact our office for further information. Payments may also be paid by telephone 24 hours a day by calling (888) 592-6221 or online by visiting the City website at <a href="https://www.ci.lancaster.oh.us">www.ci.lancaster.oh.us</a> and selecting Pay My Bill. Upon electing to pay via telephone or online, customers will be linked to NCR, our third-party payment processor. A convenience fee of \$3.35 will be charged for all online and telephone credit/debit cards payments. This fee is paid directly to NCR. The City of Enneager Utilities Collection Office does not retain any portion of this fee.

### FAILURE TO RECEIVE A BILL DOES NOT WAIVE OBLIGATIONS TO PAY SAME WHEN DUE

To avoid a 5% late fee, payment must be in our office by the due date. Previous balances are due immediately. Past due bills are subject to collection and or disconnect. If utility service is terminated, a restoration fee of \$190.00 and the total account balance must be paid prior to services being restored the next business day. If utility service is incorrectly terminated, the service will be restored upon demand without charge (a responsible adult, 18 years of age, must be available at the service address for services to be restored).

You may avoid termination by taking one or more of the following actions prior to the scheduled termination date:

- 1. If you personally owe utility service charges, which are past due, you should pay the bill in full.
- 2. If you dispute the proposed termination, in whole or part, you may request a hearing to contest termination. The Request for Hearing form is for billing errors, policy issues or other matters unrelated to a Customer's inability to meet the minimum payment requirement. Inquiries or disputes on a specific utility bill must be made prior to the notice due date in person or by telephone to attempt to verbally resolve their complaint with an employee of the Utilities Collection Office. If the customer cannot resolve the complaint in this manner, the customer may request a hearing to appeal the Department's decision to the Service-Safety Director or the Director's designee. The Request for Hearing form must be submitted in person to the Service-Safety Director within five (5) business days of the notice date. If a hearing is requested before the scheduled date for termination, termination will not take place until the hearing process is complete. If you request a hearing, you have the right to examine Utilities Office records concerning the service address; to bring a representative to help you at the hearing and to bring witnesses to testify on your behalf;
- Or, if you are a residential user of utility services with individual meters per service address at the address to be terminated and if the
  customer responsible for paying the utility bill does not live at your address, you may avoid termination by paying only the current
  month's utility bill, the standard residential deposit and agreeing to contract for your own utility usage.

Should you dispute the reason for proposed termination, wish to request a hearing, require additional explanation of your hearing rights or your rights to assume responsibility for utility charges, please immediately contact our office at (740) 687-6627, press 3 for Customer Service.

The Notice of Termination is included on this bill, in the second rectangular box from the top, and is the minimum amount required for continued service. Please note, the minimum amount required is approximately 30 days past due as of the due date on this bill.
