**Meeting**

The Commissioners met at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioners Hearing Room located at 210 E. Main St., Lancaster, OH. **Welcome**

Commissioner Davis opened the meeting by welcoming everyone in attendance.

**Workforce Update**

Workforce & Economic Development Director Rick Szabrak introduced Deshawn Toney and provided a brief overview of the Workforce & Economic Development presentation.

Deshawn Toney highlighted continued growth across Workforce Center programs, including 100 students enrolled in pre-apprenticeships, 230 in career readiness programs, 46 in driver's education, and 28 in phlebotomy. She noted the launch of a new plumbing pre-apprenticeship program and shared that local partners, Licking Memorial, Hocking College, and Hocking County Community Hospital have offered employment opportunities and tuition assistance to participating students. A video featuring a robotic project designed by an Ohio University-Lancaster student was shown.

Bayley Fields provided updates on rapid response efforts assisting displaced workers affected by closures and layoffs in Ross, Hocking, and Pickaway counties, including Pixelle, Smead, and Geodis. Fields shared that job fairs and hiring events have been successful, noting Rural King hired most of its staff during its first hiring event. She also discussed expanded social media outreach efforts through the OhioMeansJobs platform.

Aaron Kennedy provided updates on Fairfield County Transit and the recent soft launch of the new PINGO app. The system allows dispatchers to better monitor routes, drivers, and scheduling while providing more detailed reporting and operational flexibility. Kennedy explained that riders can also download the PINGO app for route and scheduling information.

Commissioner Davis asked about passenger feedback and Kennedy responded that they had not yet received feedback and the system is still being monitored during the launch phase. Discussion

also focused on transit branding and ensuring riders connect both the LINK and PINGO names through marketing efforts.

Commissioner Davis expressed appreciation for the Workforce and Transit teams and shared his excitement about the vision and progress being made.

Commissioner Levacy commented on the increased visibility of transit services throughout the community.

**Quarterly Budget Update**

Bart Hampson presented Fairfield County's first quarter 2026 financial update, highlighting continued revenue growth and stable fiscal performance despite uncertainty in several revenue streams. Hampson explained that the General Fund includes ten major revenue categories and noted that officials continue monitoring economic conditions and their potential impacts. General Fund revenues totaled \$26.9 million in Q1 2026, compared to \$23.3 million during the same period in 2025, representing a \$3.6 million increase year over year. Significant growth came from property taxes, fees for services, sales tax, conveyance fees, and investment earnings. Hampson also noted that Fairfield County's sales tax rate has remained unchanged at 6.75% since 2010, with only about 15% of Ohio counties maintaining the same rate. He added that auto sales tax collections were down 13% in April.

Commissioner Steve Davis asked about a tighter estimate for sales tax projections moving forward, as the county continues monitoring economic trends.

On the expenditure side, Hampson reported that General Fund expenses totaled \$19.8 million in Q1 2026, down from \$21.1 million in Q1 2025, a decrease of approximately 5.9%. He explained that capital improvements largely drove expenditures, while lower transfers and reduced capital outlay contributed to the overall decrease. County officials continue to monitor spending closely and adjust based on the financial environment while also preparing for the 2027 budget process.

Commissioner Jeff Fix commented that rising gasoline prices could potentially impact departments operating large vehicle fleets.

Hampson responded that the county has not yet formally analyzed that impact but will continue watching fuel trends and potential changes in consumer behavior.

Commissioner Levacy asked about adjustments related to state property tax information.

**Interview for Commissioners' Board Appointment, Meals on Wheels**

Colleen Cook introduced herself and shared her professional background and interest in serving on the Meals on Wheels Board. A lifelong Fairfield County resident, Cook attended college in Columbus before returning to the area. She explained that she worked as a bank branch manager in Bremen and later in party retail management before joining Fairfield County in 2024 in a human resources role. Cook also noted her involvement as past president of DDL and said she is currently transitioning out of that position and looking for additional opportunities to give back to the community. She shared that personal experiences with aging parents and in-laws have given her a deeper understanding of the importance of services like Meals on Wheels. During the COVID-19 pandemic, she volunteered with Meals on Wheels in a limited capacity and expressed interest in continuing to serve the organization and the community.

Commissioner Levacy asked whether Cook would have the time necessary to serve effectively on the board.

Cook responded that she had discussed the commitment with Corey Clark, who currently serves on the board, and felt the responsibilities aligned well with her current workload and availability.

Commissioner Jeff Fix expressed appreciation for community members willing to serve on boards and asked whether she believed Meals on Wheels could improve in any area.

Cook replied that she felt it would be premature for her to make recommendations without more experience working with the organization and suggested revisiting the question after she had served for some time.

Anna Tobin thanked Cook for her willingness to serve.

Cook concluded by offering to answer any additional follow-up questions.

*Resolution Review*

There are 29 resolutions on the agenda for the Regular voting meeting.

Resolutions of note:

- The first resolution on the agenda is to approve two proclamations. We have a resolution to recognize May as ALS Awareness Month. Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis is a progressive and terminal disease that affects not only the person diagnosed, but also their family, friends, and community. ALS Awareness Month was declared to not only honor those that are living with, or who have died from, the disease, but also to recognize the many caregivers and healthcare providers.

The other proclamation is to recognize May 15<sup>th</sup> as National Peace Officers' Memorial Day and May 10-16 as National Police Week. Peace Officers' Memorial Day was established as a day to pay special recognition to officers, and their families, who were injured or lost their lives, in the line of duty. National Police Week allows a special opportunity to honor the service and sacrifice of law enforcement officers across the nation.

Commissioner Davis stated he is honored to speak and recognize those that have served.

- The second resolution is to approve the reappointment of Lisa Evangelista to the Fairfield County District Library Board. This is for an additional four-year term that will begin June 1<sup>st</sup> and expire May 31, 2030.
- The Commissioners have a resolution to approve amending the annual assessments for certain Drainage Maintenance Districts to the Fairfield County Auditor's Office, and another resolution to establish a fund and the budget for the Cybersecurity Grant Program.
- Economic and Workforce Development has a resolution to approve a subgrant agreement with the Freeland Foundation to provide funds for pre-apprenticeship training through a grant from the Ohio Department of Development.
- EMA has three resolutions related to a Natural Resource Conservation Services Federal grant. These resolutions will approve the grant agreement, approve an advance and grant match, and approve appropriations for receipts collected for the Fetters Run Project.
- The Engineer's Office has three resolutions to award the 2026 crack seal project, to award the pavement markings project, and to approve the purchase of liquid asphalt.

**Updates from Elected Officials and Department Heads**

Treasurer James Bahnsen shared that county treasurers from across Ohio would gather the following week for the spring county treasurers conference, noting it provides a valuable opportunity to compare Fairfield County's operations and performance with other counties across the state.

Recorder Lisa McKenzie offered condolences following the recent passing of a County Recorder from another Ohio county.

Engineer Jeremiah Upp reported that the Engineer's Office continues to oversee several active construction projects throughout the county.

Auditor Carri Brown provided updates on second-half tax collections, explaining that collections are expected to be lower due to property tax adjustments. Brown stated she does not anticipate changes to current sales tax estimates and noted that the timing of collections will largely relate to property tax adjustments. She also shared that the Board of Revision workload has remained manageable due to the use of informal hearings and reported that the county audit process is progressing well.

Tony Vogel commented the economy is leading to increases in utility shut offs and said he is continuing to monitor the situation.

Rick Szabrak expressed appreciation for the opportunity to speak at the Ohio University-Lancaster graduation ceremony and noted that many graduates are entering the local workforce.

Jon Kochis shared that the county's elevator modernization project is expected to begin soon.

Corey Clark announced that Job and Family Services is preparing for the summer youth employment program for youth ages 14 to 18, with participants earning \$13 per hour through a state-funded program at no cost to employers.

Bart Hampson thanked the Auditor's and Engineer's Offices for their collaboration on county improvement projects and ongoing efforts to enhance programs and services.

Jeff Porter noted that Facilities is assisting with significant improvements to the Dog Shelter.

Kelsey Miller stated that RPC would not meet that day and shared that a recent community development information meeting had been held successfully.

**Old Business**

Commissioner Levacy shared that he recently attended the ADAMH Annual Dinner alongside Commissioner Jeff Fix and described the event as very well done. The commissioner expressed appreciation for the opportunity to support the fundraiser and recognized the important work being done throughout Fairfield County to support mental health and recovery services.

Commissioner Fix echoed those sentiments, noting the event served as a reminder of the many people and organizations working to strengthen the community. Fix also expressed appreciation for the recent America 250-Ohio Heritage Tree celebration and the community participation surrounding the event.

Commissioner Davis shared that he attended the Wright State University graduation ceremony, where his brother delivered the commencement address. Davis spoke positively about the experience and the opportunity to celebrate graduates as they begin the next chapter of their lives.

Commissioner Fix stated that it continues to be an honor to serve Fairfield County and expressed gratitude following his anticipated election victory after running unopposed for another term as Commissioner. He also spoke about the many community events currently on the Commissioners' schedule and mentioned that the Pickerington Area Chamber of Commerce is moving into a new home.

Commissioner Steve Davis discussed upcoming Multi-County Juvenile Detention Center (MCJDC) annual meetings and noted ongoing discussions regarding a contract with Franklin County. Davis explained that Franklin County recently canceled its contract for eight beds at the facility, resulting in an estimated \$600,000 revenue shortfall that will need to be addressed. He also expressed enthusiasm for speaking at the upcoming Workforce Center graduation ceremony and noted that he is honored to be speaking at the Police Memorial event.
