**Review Meeting**

The Commissioners met at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioners Hearing Room located at 210 E. Main St., Lancaster, OH. **Welcome**

Commissioner Davis opened the meeting by welcoming everyone in attendance.

**Listen & Learn, Utilities**

Tony Vogel spoke about the Fairfield County Utility Department and what it takes to provide safe water to homes and businesses. He explained that developing a utility system begins with locating sufficient water sources and building a water treatment facility. Proper planning is necessary to determine both the water source and the amount of water needed for future demand.

Once an aquifer is identified and the facility is built, the next step is planning and installing water lines to serve customers. At that point, the utility becomes a full operation with water operators, billing staff, and construction departments. In addition to providing water service, utilities must also develop wastewater collection and treatment systems.

Using contour maps, utility planners determine where sewer lines should be placed. The size of the sewer lines depends on the type and scale of development being served. After the sewer system is planned, a wastewater treatment facility must also be constructed. Vogel emphasized that utility departments plan daily while considering the long-term consequences of each project. He noted that villages do not always have the resources necessary to provide all required services on their own and Fairfield County Utilities has been assisting when asked.

Commissioner Fix commented that it is easy to overlook the many steps involved in utility development. He added that smaller communities often lack sufficient resources and expressed appreciation for the assistance that Tony and Josh provide to those areas.

Commissioner Levacy added that county growth continues alongside villages and townships and noted that the assistance provided to Millersport has been invaluable.

**CDBG, Second Hearing, 9:15 a.m.**

Holly Mattei spoke about the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program and recognized the individuals in attendance who came in support of the proposed projects. She noted that the first public hearing was held in March and provided an overview of the program. Mattei explained that the grants are federal funds distributed through the state, and Hicks Partners has assisted with the application process. Applications are due June 10.

Proposed allocation projects include a parking lot project for the Village of Thurston, waterline improvements for the Village of Baltimore, sanitary sewer improvements for the Village of Amanda, transportation funding for the Salvation Army, and administrative funding for Fair Housing.

The Neighborhood Revitalization Project for the Village of Thurston includes street and sidewalk improvements, waterline replacement, and administrative costs. Mattei added that the Village of Thurston has committed matching funds, which will strengthen its application. The Village of Carroll is seeking approximately \$500,000 for waterline replacement. The next step in the process will be for the commissioners to adopt legislation, after which Regional Planning will finalize and submit the grant applications.

Commissioner Davis asked about applications that were not approved.

Mattei responded that CDBG recently awarded \$800,000 to the Village of Bremen. She added that Habitat for Humanity was not eligible for the grant, and the Pickerington Food pantry request, which totaled approximately \$3,000, was not moved forward for consideration due to the small amount requested.

Commissioner Levacy thanked Regional Planning for its work on the grant applications.

Commissioner Fix commented that it is significant that the program is helping communities in every corner of Fairfield County.

Commissioner Davis then asked whether anyone in attendance who had not received funding wished to speak, followed by asking whether supporters of the proposed projects would like to comment.

Matt Brown, representing several communities, stated that Thurston is very appreciative of the county's support, and that the Village of Amanda is pleased to meet the criteria necessary to move forward with its project.

Casey Farmer of Baltimore thanked the commissioners for considering the village's waterline improvement project. He added that the project is about more than water service, emphasizing that it is also an important fire protection project.

Gary Silcott, speaking on behalf of the Village of Carroll, discussed the village's current water costs and said the goal is to keep water and wastewater services affordable for residents.

Kelly Bauman of Sugar Grove stated she was representing the Salvation Army and noted that the organization's vehicles are aging. She thanked the commissioners for considering the transportation funding request.

Commissioner Davis asked whether anyone wished to comment on or ask questions about any of the proposed projects. He then closed the public hearing at 9:33 a.m. and thanked everyone in attendance.

**County Administration Update**

- *The County Administration Update was provided by County Administrator, Aundrea Cordle, unless otherwise indicated.*

**Week in Review**

Administrator Cordle spoke about the Brownfield remediation program. Governor Mike DeWine and Department of Development Director Lydia Mihalik recently announced \$61.1 million in Brownfield Remediation Program grants to support 84 cleanup/remediation projects and 76 assessment projects across 75 Ohio counties. Since the program was launched in 2021, more than 840 projects totaling nearly \$740 million have been funded statewide. Under HB 96, each county received a \$1 million set-aside for State Fiscal Year 2026, and counties with remaining funds can apply for additional grants through June 5 before the fiscal year ends in June. For SFY 2027, \$108 million has been appropriated, though future applications will be evaluated solely on merit rather than county set-asides.

Among the recipients, the Fairfield County Land Bank was awarded \$1 million for cleanup of the former Barclay Petroleum Property, a nearly 10-acre former petroleum pump station. The project will remove contaminated materials and petroleum-impacted soil, dispose of outdated infrastructure, and restore the site to environmental standards. Once remediation is complete, the property is expected to be transferred to the Village of Bremen for recreational development, including soccer fields, a softball diamond, trails, ADA-accessible paths, and creek access amenities. Administrator Cordle thanked Treasurer Bahnsen and the Fairfield County Land Bank for their work in obtaining the grant and their work with the program.

**Updates from Elected Officials and Department Heads**

Treasurer Bahnsen spoke about bad debts and efforts to initiate discussions with state representatives regarding House Bill 493 which would eliminate the ability to sell tax liens as a part of collection efforts.

Engineer Upp reported that the department is preparing to begin paving projects. He said the county is moving forward with the design of the mixed-use path along Refugee Road while continuing broader corridor reconstruction planning. Upp also noted that the engineer's office is working with the City of Lancaster on a section of Ety Road and is nearing the start of construction on Basil-Western Road.

Auditor Brown provided several updates from her office. She noted that the office recently released a video explaining the latest property tax reforms, and discussed updates to the county website, including a new delinquency list feature that provides real-time information. She stated that the office is celebrating the one-year anniversary of DocLink. Brown added that the county audit is progressing well and thanked departments for their participation and cooperation. Brown also said the office is on track regarding implementation of House Bill 186, including work involving school refunds and credits. She noted that the office has been heavily engaged in making those processes successful. Additionally, she mentioned that new legislation has been introduced regarding rounding procedures and said the office has been reaching out to other counties concerning GIS usage and how it is permitted under the Ohio Administrative Code.

Rick Szabrak reported that he recently attended a conference focused on growth and development, where Fairfield County received numerous compliments. He also stated that he has an upcoming meeting with Anduril to discuss potential partnerships and projects involving the company. Szabrak added that Fairfield County continues to lead on important issues, even when topics may be controversial.

Corey Clark said he is looking forward to the agency's all-staff meeting this week, an event held twice each year that focuses on employee recognition and appreciation.

Nikki Drake discussed the stormwater pollution survey currently available on the organization's website. She also promoted the upcoming Earth Day summer camp for elementary students, noting that registration is now open. Drake added that the camp, scheduled for June, is designed for students in grades three through five.

Commissioner Fix reported that he recently participated in a housing panel discussion where Columbus Mayor Andrew Ginther commended Fairfield County for its involvement and leadership on housing issues.

Commissioner Levacy spoke about the Forest Rose graduation, stating that he is encouraged by the staff's dedication and the way they prepare and provide support for students.

Commissioner Davis reported that he recently addressed a local Kiwanis group. He also spoke about the county's youth incarceration rate, which is significantly lower than it has been historically.
