Review Meeting

The Commissioners met at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioners Hearing Room located at 210 E. Main St., Lancaster, OH. Commissioner Davis called the meeting to order, and the following Commissioners were present: Steve Davis, Jeff Fix and David Levacy. Welcome

Commissioner Davis opened the meeting by welcoming everyone in attendance.

Presentation by Scott Brown, Office of the Auditor of the State of Ohio

Scott Brown read a letter from Ohio State Auditor Keith Faber congratulating Commissioner Dave Levacy on his appointment as Chair of the Ohio Elder Abuse Commission. The letter noted that the Commission, which operates under the Ohio Attorney General's Office, works to address elder abuse and promote prevention efforts throughout the state.

Commissioner Levacy thanked Scott Brown and the State Auditor's Office for their recognition and commendation.

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Health Department Update

Health Commissioner Joe Ebel provided an update on the Community Health Assessment, which helps the Health Department and its community partners identify local health needs and priority areas. He also discussed ongoing planning efforts for the future of the Health Department, noting that the Community Health Assessment serves as a living document that guides decision-making and strategic initiatives.

Ebel highlighted the department's status as a nationally accredited health department, noting that more than 90 percent of Ohio residents are served by accredited health departments, the highest percentage in the nation. He also reported that WIC caseloads have increased over the past several years, particularly at the Pickerington office, which has expanded operations from two days per week to five days per week to meet growing demand.

Ebel provided an update on the department's garage project, stating that staff have moved into the facility and are pleased with the additional space. The project has allowed the department to eliminate leases on four separate storage sites and better accommodate large deliveries of cribs, car seats, and other supplies.

He also discussed the growing prevalence of Lyme disease in Fairfield County, reporting that 11 cases have already been identified this year. Ebel emphasized that prevention remains the best defense against tick-borne illnesses, recommending that residents avoid areas with tall grass and dense vegetation. He explained that Lyme disease transmission typically requires a tick to be attached for approximately 24 hours and that early detection and antibiotic treatment are critical. While American dog ticks do not carry Lyme disease, they can transmit other illnesses. Residents are encouraged to remove ticks promptly and monitor for symptoms. He also noted that tick collection stations have been established in several parks to assist with monitoring efforts.

Ebel announced that his contract has been extended through February 2027 and that Baylie Blevins has been appointed Deputy Health Commissioner. He also shared that he plans to retire in February 2027, explaining that his original five-year contract was extended for several additional months to assist with the leadership transition.

Commissioner Davis asked about the symptoms of Lyme disease and congratulated Blevins on her appointment.

Commissioner Fix thanked Ebel for his leadership and the positive direction of the Health Department.

Commissioner Levacy commended Ebel for transforming the department and referenced the Community Health Assessment survey, which generated approximately 700 responses from residents. Ebel noted that considerable effort was made to distribute the survey and encourage community participation.

Public Comments

Ray Stemen of Lancaster spoke on his concerns regarding the rise of artificial intelligence. He provided a prayer.

Week in Review

Meeting Dates

There will be no Board of Commissioners meetings on July 7 or July 14. Review and Regular Meetings will continue to be held each Tuesday throughout June beginning at 9:00 a.m.

House Bill 180

Substitute House Bill 180 has been introduced and includes provisions that would permit split shifts for Precinct Election Officials (PEOs) while also modifying their compensation structure.

Under the proposed legislation, PEO base pay would increase from the current \$133.72 to \$246.40 for a full-day shift, equivalent to 140 percent of Ohio's projected 2026 minimum wage. Officials working less than half a day would receive \$228.80, or 130 percent of the projected minimum wage. Because Ohio's minimum wage has increased annually in recent years, compensation rates could continue to rise in the future. Based on the projected 2026 rates, the Fairfield County Board of Elections estimates the proposal would increase its Precinct Election Officials budget by approximately \$60,000.

Commissioner Davis expressed concern that the State is imposing an unfunded mandate on counties by requiring increased compensation without providing additional funding.

Potential Resolution Regarding Use of the Fairfield County Jail for Imprisoning Individuals Who Violate Municipal Ordinances

County Administrator Aundrea Cordle advised the Commissioners that a resolution may be added to a future agenda regarding the use of the Fairfield County Jail for individuals sentenced through Mayor's Courts for violations of municipal ordinances.

Assistant Prosecuting Attorney Amy Brown-Thompson provided background on the issue, explaining that the Commissioners could adopt a resolution regarding the use of the county jail by municipalities. She noted that, except for the Village of Canal Winchester, villages currently do not have contracts with the county for use of the jail. If the proposed resolution is adopted, villages without agreements could be prohibited from using the facility for ordinance violations.

Commissioner Davis noted that the decision ultimately rests with the Board of Commissioners.

Brown-Thompson confirmed that the issue applies only to villages prosecuting violations under their own municipal ordinances.

Commissioner Davis expressed concern regarding accountability when municipalities place individuals in the county jail without a formal agreement in place, questioning who bears responsibility for the inmate's care and associated costs.

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Brown-Thompson noted that Fairfield County maintains contracts with other entities that utilize the jail and stated that Ohio law does not provide municipalities with unrestricted access to county jail facilities without an agreement.

Resolution Review

- Regional Planning has a resolution to approve the Basil Western Logistics LLC Subdivision development agreement
- The Sheriff's Office has two resolutions, one to extend the Premier Physicians/Team Health contract and another to approve the CFLP Litter Law Enforcement Application.
- Community Action has a resolution to approve of the disposal of recycling program equipment that is no longer utilized.

Budget Review

Budget Director Bart Hampson reported that the county's 2027 budget process is continuing, with meetings being held regularly with county departments to review funding requests and operational needs. Hampson stated that approximately half of the departmental budget meetings have been completed as staff continue developing the proposed 2027 budget.

Updates from Elected Officials and Department Heads

Treasurer Jim Bahnsen reported that county finances remain relatively stable and that Fairfield County is currently in a strong financial position.

Recorder Lisa McKenzie stated that her office is completing the final proofing and redaction process for scanned records. The goal is to make the images publicly available online by the end of the month, which will significantly improve public access and record searches. She also noted that she will be attending the Ohio Recorders' Conference next week.

Auditor Carri Brown reported that the Budget Commission has approved its budget and that the Board of Revision is expected to conclude its work by September. She announced that the county's lodging tax portal is now available online and that updates to the real estate website are forthcoming, with a press release planned to inform the public of the changes. Brown also shared that the county's 2025 audit report has been submitted and expressed satisfaction with how smoothly the audit process went this year. Additionally, the Auditor's Office's current "Map of the Month" highlights cemeteries throughout the county.

Utilities Director Tony Vogel provided an update on ongoing discussions surrounding data centers. He reported that the Vantage Data Center project continues to progress and reiterated that the facility will generate its own power and utilize less water than a typical data center.

Economic & Workforce Development Director Rick Szabrak reported that he recently met with representatives from Anduril, and that company officials are scheduled to visit the Workforce Center next week. He also noted that the county's annual Signing Day event will be held this week, marking the eighth year of the program.

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Commissioner Davis asked whether there are any additional large-scale development projects currently under consideration.

Szabrak, in response, discussed recent changes in state law that limit what economic development information can be publicly disclosed during certain stages of negotiations. He stated that the changes reduce transparency compared to previous practices and noted that the county has historically valued openness in the development process.

EMA & Facilities Director Jon Kochis reported that state disaster relief funding has been approved and that the funds will be distributed accordingly.

IT Director Daniel Neeley stated that phishing awareness testing continues throughout county government as part of ongoing cybersecurity efforts. He also reported recent staffing changes within the Information Technology Department.

JFS Director Corey Clark reminded those in attendance that the World Elder Abuse Awareness Day event will be held on June 10th at the Levacy Center.

Old Business

Commissioner Fix reported that he recently met with representatives from Regional Planning to discuss next steps related to housing initiatives throughout Fairfield County. He stated that Regional Planning is organizing another series of tours and meetings with village and township officials this summer to continue discussions on housing needs and opportunities. Commissioner Fix also reported that he had a productive meeting with representatives from Greenfield Township and the City of Lancaster regarding a cooperative development agreement designed to provide mutual benefits to both jurisdictions. In addition, he noted that he was scheduled to meet with Rick Ricketts and other stakeholders to discuss ongoing projects in Violet Township.

Commissioner Levacy shared highlights from his Memorial Day activities in Millersport, where he participated in the community's observance honoring those who have served in the military. He noted that Colonel Tom Moe delivered remarks during the ceremony and described the event as one of the most touching Memorial Day observances he has attended, recognizing the sacrifices made by members of the armed forces and their families.

New Business

Commissioner Levacy stated he will be attending the upcoming Pre-Apprenticeship Signing Day event and providing remarks. He expressed enthusiasm for the program, noting that the event is exciting not only for the students who are committing to career pathways but also for the employers who are eager to welcome and invest in the next generation of skilled workers.

Commissioner Davis reported that he recently met with Budget Director Bart Hampson to discuss county financial matters, including recent sales tax revenue trends. Davis stated that several major development projects currently underway could have a significant positive impact on future revenues. He noted that projects such as Google, Borealis, and Vantage have the potential to generate substantial economic activity and could result in sales tax growth that exceeds recent increases, potentially surpassing 13 percent as those projects continue to develop
