Review Meeting

The Commissioners met at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioners Hearing Room located at 210 E. Main St., Lancaster, OH. Welcome

Commissioner Davis opened the meeting by welcoming everyone in attendance.

Public Comments

None.

Presentation of Letter from the Office of the Ohio Auditor of State

Scott Brown, Regional Liaison for the Ohio Auditor of State, presented two letters of recognition and appreciation on behalf of the Auditor's Office.

The first letter recognized Fairfield County for receiving two 2026 National Association of Counties (NACo) Achievement Awards—one for the Fairfield County 2025–2028 Strategic Plan and another for the innovative Fairfield County Internal Stop Loss Pool Program. The letter also noted that Fairfield County has earned 21 NACo Achievement Awards over the past decade, reflecting the County's sustained commitment to innovation, operational excellence, and effective public service.

Mr. Brown also presented a letter recognizing Fairfield County Administrator Aundrea Cordle on her appointment as President of the National Public Employer Labor Relations Association (NPELRA). He spoke about the significance of the organization and commended Ms. Cordle on this distinguished national leadership appointment.

First Hearing for Sturbridge Meadows Ditch Petition

Commissioner Davis outlined the procedures for the hearing and administered the oath to all individuals who intended to provide testimony.

Eric McCrady reported that pursuant to Ohio Revised Code 6131.09, the County Engineer completed a preliminary review of the Sturbridge Meadows Ditch Petition. The petition seeks to improve drainage between the Sturbridge Meadows and New England Acres subdivisions by cleaning the existing drainage swale, replacing a failed 12-inch storm sewer, and reducing flooding

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caused by runoff from approximately 98 acres of agricultural land. The contributing watershed within Fairfield County is approximately 33.5 acres. The Engineer's Office evaluated two preliminary solutions:

Option 1: Replace the failed 12-inch storm sewer with a 36-inch pipe, providing capacity for approximately a 1-year storm event, at an estimated cost of \$1.1 million.

Option 2 (recommended): Replace the failed 12-inch storm sewer with an 18-inch pipe and construct an upstream detention basin on nearly two acres to control runoff and sediment. The basin would be designed to manage a 10-year storm event, with larger storms flowing through the existing swale. This option, including construction, inspection, easements, and damages, is estimated to cost \$1.6 million.

Under Ohio Revised Code 6131.09, McCrady identified both favorable and unfavorable factors associated with the proposed improvement. Favorable factors include replacing the failed storm sewer, improving drainage capacity, and restoring an unobstructed outlet for agricultural field tiles. The proposed improvements would provide additional flood relief through either larger storm sewer pipes or upstream water detention. Unfavorable factors include the removal of approximately 46 mature trees, demolition of at least one garage, relocation of underground utilities, and significant construction impacts. Additionally, the project would directly benefit only about 20% of the 33.5-acre watershed.

Based on these factors, the Engineer's Office concluded that the estimated construction costs substantially outweigh the anticipated benefits.

Joseph Pickering provided testimony in opposition to the ditch petition. He stated that he owns agricultural property west of the subdivision and has invested more than \$100,000 in drainage improvements since purchasing the property in 1979, including constructing and rebuilding waterways. Mr. Pickering asserted that neighboring property owners altered the drainage course by placing fill within the waterway, which he believes contributed to the current drainage issues. He stated that additional improvements were completed between 2022 and 2024 but that the drainage has not functioned properly since the neighboring properties were altered. He opposed the petition and objected to any additional assessments against his property.

Karen Sottosanti testified in opposition to the ditch petition, stating that her property is not impacted by the drainage issues. She expressed concern that the estimated project costs would impose an unsustainable financial burden on affected property owners and could force some residents to sell their homes.

Eric Garrett testified in opposition to the ditch petition, stating that the project would create a significant financial burden for property owners while providing no direct benefit to his property.

Sherry Lape testified in support of the ditch petition. She stated that runoff from the adjacent farmland has caused erosion on her property and alleged that changes in farming practices redirected the flow of water into the subdivision. Ms. Lape noted that residents have attempted to work with neighboring property owners to address the drainage concerns and have discussed the construction of a retention basin. She also referenced a past incident involving a child who was swept into the culvert, expressing concerns for public safety, continued erosion, and the long-term stability of the roadway. She stated her support for the proposed improvement.

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Darla Murdock testified in support of the ditch petition. She stated that drainage conditions have deteriorated over time and attributed the increased runoff to changes in farming practices. Ms. Murdock described ongoing erosion, standing water, mosquito infestations, and damage to landscaping and improvements on her property. She expressed concern that the conditions continue to worsen with each significant rainfall.

John Thompson testified in support of the ditch petition. He emphasized public safety concerns associated with the drainage conditions. Mr. Thompson stated that increased runoff from the farmland has accelerated erosion within the subdivision and requested construction of a retention basin to help control the flow of water.

Rod Oberster testified in support of the ditch petition. He stated that portions of his property now remain saturated for much of the year and attributed the increased drainage problems to the removal of former water retention areas on the adjacent farmland.

Karen Oberster testified in support of the ditch petition and stated that the petition was originally signed by 21 property owners in favor of pursuing the proposed improvement.

Commissioner Davis moved to recess the hearing at 9:47 a.m. Commissioner Fix seconded the motion. Following a voice vote, the motion carried, and the hearing was recessed.

Week in Review

SNAP Payment Error Rates

The Ohio Department of Job and Family Services released its first quarterly report on county-specific SNAP payment error rates, as required by House Bill 434. The report is based on a sample of March 2026 SNAP cases reviewed by county agencies using a new state-developed quality control process.

Fairfield County performed exceptionally well, recording a 0.00% SNAP payment error rate for March 2026, with no payment errors identified in the cases reviewed. Corey Clark previously noted that Fairfield County's performance is below the statewide error rate and that the county has not recorded any SNAP payment errors in 2026 to date. Statewide, the preliminary March 2026 error rate was 6.87%, while Ohio's official Federal Fiscal Year 2025 payment error rate was 6.76%. County Job and Family Services agencies will continue conducting monthly case reviews under the new reporting system to help improve payment accuracy and reduce the state's future financial liability under federal SNAP cost-sharing requirements.

Lorain County Commissioners

The Lorain County Commissioners, on behalf of the Lorain County Job and Family Services team, sent a letter to Corey Clark to express gratitude for organizational assistance during a period of significant staff reductions in their county. Our JFS provided support which minimized program delays and ensured crucial benefits and services reached families and children without disruption. The letter highlights the timely, generous, and collaborative spirit of the county partnership and can be viewed in the Commissioners' Review Packet.

Resolutions of note:

- EMA has a resolution to approve a grant agreement between the Commissioners and the Ohio Department of Public Safety/Ohio EMA for the State Homeland Security Program Grant.
- The Engineer's Office has a resolution to approve the contract and Notice to Commence for the Lithopolis-Winchester Road Resurfacing Project. Kokosing Construction Company, Inc., was awarded the bid in June for the resurfacing project.
- The Lancaster-Fairfield Community Action Agency has two resolutions on the agenda. The first to approve of the disposal of unutilized equipment, and the second to approve the satisfaction of a mortgage for a home rehabilitation that was under the Neighborhood Stabilization Program.
- Transit has a resolution to amend the Fairfield County Transit Zero Tolerance Drug and Alcohol Policy that was adopted last December. The policy listed the Medical Review Officer and that information has been updated. This policy and any amendments are submitted to ODOT, and other applicable agencies, in compliance with federal and state drug and alcohol testing regulations.
- Utilities has a resolution to abandon and preserve water and sewer rights in a parcel that has been annexed into the City of Canal Winchester. This resolution addresses reserving services so revenue is not lost, abandoning service rights to a parcel that has not yet been developed, and the understanding that the City of Canal Winchester may require developers to pay fees to the city as part of the development agreement.

Updates from Elected Officials and Department Heads
