Welcome

Commissioner Fix opened the meeting by welcoming everyone in attendance.

<u> Listen and Learn – Law Library</u>

Assistant Prosecuting Attorney, Josh Horacek, provided a listen and learn on the Law Library. He began by providing a brief history on the Law Library in Fairfield County. The Law Library board consists of 5 members. The purpose of the Law Library Board is to provide legal research goals and resources to the county, courts, and other organizations. It is critical for individuals to be able to access this information. Three computer terminals are supplied which provides them with tools for conducting research. The board keeps law books up to date and maintain other physical copies not available online. The sources of funding come from a portion of fines, penalties, and forfeited bail from the courts, from grants, and from appropriations from the Board of Commissioners. Josh went on to show the Law Library Board revenue since 2017.

Commissioner Davis asked what utilization looks like currently versus past years.

Josh explained that utilization seems to have gone up.

Commissioners Levacy and Fix thanked Josh for his great work with the Law Library and the Prosecutor's Office.

Chris Schmelzer from Bremen gave his opinions on how the federal government impacts local government.

Week in Review

ARP Update

From the \$30,607,546.77 received as the first and second tranche of fiscal recovery funds. \$18.9M has been appropriated, \$7.4M expended, \$6.7M encumbered or obligated.

Developmental Disabilities (DD) Board Member Vacancy

The County Commissioners are seeking applicants of qualified, passionate adults who are an immediate family member of an individual eligible for early intervention services for preschool or school-age children. DD Board member positions are volunteer positions, and the County Commissioners are seeking dedicated, qualified applicants to begin serving immediately, for a term to expire December 31, 2025.

David Uhl explained that the requirements outlined in the DD board vacancy does make the window of applicants smaller but that is a statutory requirement.

Commissioner Fix agreed with Commissioner Davis and believed it could be included in the budget process. He asked the Sheriff how many agencies partner with the jail.


Sheriff Lape stated there are five outside agencies and they have stated they prefer the facility at the Fairfield County Jail.

MORPC Update

Commissioner Fix welcomed the representatives from MORPC.



Annabel Peterson and Megan Stein provided an update on MORPC's process on adopting an Economic Development District. Megan explained that the Mid-Ohio region is comprised of 11 counties and Fairfield County has been a big part of the success of the project. MORPC will coordinate across the region on workforce needs, infrastructure planning, funding opportunities, and economic development goals.

Commissioner Fix asked if this plan would help to unlock funding from the federal government.

Megan confirmed it would secure federal funding and explained MORPC is very close to securing this plan.

Director of Economic Development, Rick Szabrak, stated they secured additional funding by getting set up with the EDA.

Megan went on to describe some of the Economic Development District benefits.

Commissioner Fix asked if they had a specific number on the amount of funding.

Megan did not have a specific number to provide but believed it to be substantial. She went on to speak on some of the EDA Grant Programs. The federal government continues to release more and more funding. There exist some EDD designation requirements and added that there are several counties in the region that fit these requirements.

Commissioner Levacy asked if the Appalachian Counties in the region are included in the district.

Megan Stein explained that none of the counties in Appalachia are included in the district with Fairfield County. There will be a regional board with representatives from Fairfield County. MORPC will be working with the County to update and ensure the competitive advantage projects are up to date. They will work with Rick Szabrak and the Commissioners on what upgrades need to happen that would fall under the counties competitive advantage projects. One of the key takeaways is to gain the support from the Commissioners to submit the requests. MORPC has not received any push back from any counties in the region.

Mayor for the City of Lancaster, David Scheffler, stated they have a similar opportunity to secure grant funding made possible by MORPC.

Commissioner Davis stated his appreciation for the team at MORPC.
