#### Welcome

Commissioner Fix opened the meeting by welcoming everyone in attendance and stated his appreciation for being reelected as Commissioner, and congratulated Dr. Carri Brown on being elected as Auditor.

#### Listen & Learn - Parks District

Marcey Shafer, Director of the Fairfield County Parks District, provided an update on the Parks District. She began by introducing the members of the Park Board and the staff of the department. The purpose of the Park District is to protect and conserve natural and historical sites in Fairfield County. Marcey explained some of the structural issues Rock Mill is facing which has caused it to be closed to the public. Marcey also provided updates on several other parks located around Fairfield County, and the features, programs, and services that they have.

Commissioner Levacy asked about the Rookery located in Baltimore.

Marcey explained in the coming weeks there will be a removal of buildings. It is called the Rookery because it is one of the largest heron rookeries south of Lake Erie. Once the buildings are gone, they will do a trail system.

Commissioner Davis asked Marcey about the fiscal horizon of the Park District.

Marcey stated the department successfully passed it's second levy last May. She thinks they are in a good position to maintain the parks that are currently open.

Commissioner Davis asked if there was a metric on visitation.

Marcey stated they track visitation, and reported a 40% increase during the pandemic, and have maintained a 20% increase compared to pre-pandemic levels.

Commissioner Davis asked if the Park District had any event centers.

Marcey stated they have three covered bridges that can be rented for weddings, as well as other rooms and barns that can be rented.
