The Fairfield 33 Development Alliance, in partnership with Fairfield County school's Business Advisory Council, is hosting the first ever Career Readiness Expo on April 4, 2019. The event will be held from 4 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. at Fairfield Career Center, 3985 Coonpath Rd NW, Carroll, OH 43112.

The event is open to all juniors and seniors in the county along with their parents. It will introduce local careers to these students, many of whom can start working immediately after high school.

There will be more than 30 local employers at the event. Students can bring resumes to apply for jobs, and information about career pathways will be available for individuals who wish to further their education.

"There are approximately 700 students a year in Fairfield County who graduate high school and don't immediately pursue further education," said Rick Szabrak, Fairfield County Economic and Workforce Development Director. "My hope is that parents will also attend the Expo and look at these careers the same way parents look at colleges. They can help their children pick the right career and see that many local employers offer tuition reimbursement to help pay for college."
