Fairfield County Auditor Publishes Timeline for Historic Beery House at 108 North High

Lancaster, Ohio – The Fairfield County Auditor’s Office is pleased to announce an online timeline of the Historic Beery House at 108 North High Street, the location of the Real Estate Assessment Offices.

This timeline provides a glimpse into the historical significance of the building. Built on land originally owned by Thomas E. Ewing, Sr., the building served as a home to Elizabeth Maccracken, a founding member of the local Red Cross chapter. It was also home to Dr. George Beery, a leader in building the Lancaster Municipal Hospital. The building was later home to the Red Cross, Health Department, and Sheriff’s Detective Bureau.

Dr. Carri Brown, Fairfield County Auditor, stated, “We are excited to archive this interesting history of the building, and we treasure the building for the many important services that have been provided and will be provided to the public at this location.”
