Examples of Discrimination

Policies that state: "no children"

Segregating housing so that families with children are only allowed in certain sections

Regulations prohibiting parents and children, or male and female children from sharing a bedroom.

Requiring an additional security deposit or charging extra fees

Limiting the number of children, unless there is a clear violation of an applicable occupancy code or standard

Don't let discrimination come between YOU and where you want to live!











What to do if you experience discrimination:

If you feel that you have been discriminated against while searching for or residing in housing, taking the following steps can be helpful:

Keep a record of names, dates, addresses, phone numbers and other important information which can assist in the investigation of your complaint.

Record (write down) a detailed description specific as possible about the incident.

Record the names and addresses of any witnesses to the incident if possible.

Familial Status Rights apply to:

Children Under 18

Pregnant Women

An Adult Seeking Custody of a Minor

Exceptions to Fair Housing for Families

Housing units may be exempt from familial status provisions if they meet the following criteria:

Housing for older people under a state or federal program specifically designed and operated to assist older people

All units in a complex are occupied by people who are 62 or older

People who are 55 or older occupy 80% of the units in the complex, and management publishes and adheres to policies that demonstrate an intent to provide housing for people who are 55 or older.
